ARTWORK OF JAMAICAN ARTIST BOSWELL WILLIAMS IS FEATURED AT EYE OF THE EAGLE ART IN DOWNTOWN CLAYTON FOR FEBRUARY.

February 8, 2009: The paintings of Boswell Williams will be on exhibit in the Featured Artist room for the Month of February at the Eye of the Eagle Art in Clayton, NC. The exhibit runs from February 1 through February 27, 2009. The closing reception for the artist and guests will be on Saturday February 21, 2009 from 4:00-6:00p.m. The reception is free and open to the public.

Williams is a native of Jamaica and came to the United States in 1991. He has exhibited in Philadelphia, PA, Sionna Visions Art Gallery in Plainfield NJ and in Miami, FL. Williams works primarily in oils which he favors to show off a rich color palette in both vibrant and nostalgic portraits of individuals from diverse backgrounds. He also employs ink, graphite and water color in his works. His portraits of musicians illustrate his great passion for music. He was featured in the Tribes Magazine in December/January and April/May 2008 issues. He is also an author and illustrator in his latest published children's book, "*A Fish Called Henry.*"

Williams claims his early influences came from artists like Edna Manley (Wife of late Prime Minister Norman Manley) and other local artists. "My mission is to provide a new perspective of Art without artistic bias to the art lovers of the world" said the artist.
